What do I study?



- <u>Component 1</u>: Travel and Tourism Organisations and Destinations -Learners will investigate travel and tourism organisations in the UK, their ownership, aims, key products and services, and how they work together
- <u>Component 2</u>: Customer Needs in Travel and Tourism Learners will investigate how organisations use market research to identify travel and tourism trends
- <u>Component 3: Influences on Global Travel and Tourism -</u> Learners will explore the different factors that may influence global travel and tourism, and how travel and tourism organisations and destinations respond to these factors.
