

Waltham Toll Bar Academy has a long-standing reputation for academic excellence and high standards.












High quality teaching and learning and kindness and respect for others, drives a collective will to bring out the best in every child in our care.

Students are set individual targets that challenge and motivate them to achieve their full potential.


These targets are discussed with students and reviewed regularly through a supportive system of assessment.

We are confident that, whatever a child's needs, we can put a suitable plan of action in place which helps every individual maintain their focus and ambition.









Personal Development



The Personal Development Curriculum is composed of five key areas:

- The Waltham Toll Bar way
- Health and wellbeing
- Healthy relationships
- Championing our community and beyond
- Living and prospering in contemporary Britain.

Personal Development is brought out of the classroom and all students experience focused sessions delivered by local or national experts.

In the 2023-24 academic year, we have already hosted talks from Humberside Police on Drugs and Crime, Olympic Paralympic athlete Keira Forsythe on Body Positivity and TV personality Evie Woerdenweber on social media and online bullying.

The school is proud to work with a range of local and national organisations which show the dedication of the students and staff to Personal Development.

The school is recognised as part of the UNESCO Associated Schools Network, a licenced provider for the Duke of Edinburgh award, and is working towards achieving many others this academic year.



We believe we have a duty to educate our young people beyond their academic studies.

Careers and future opportunities form a large part of our Personal Development programme.

Last academic year, more than 300 students were able to undertake work experience and gain valuable employability skills.

Each year group will have talks from professionals to showcase the opportunities and we tailor careers education to the needs of our young people and North East Lincolnshire.

When it comes to post-16 opportunities, the academy is a proud partner with a range of

providers including Toll Bar Sixth Form, GIFHE, HETA and Catch apprenticeships, Franklin College and the Royal Air Force.

The academy promotes opportunities for our young people to gain additional skills outside of their academic achievement.

We have offered a Level two qualification in Mental Health First Aid this academic year and have our Prefect and Student Ambassador programmes for learners to become academy leaders.

We currently run 60+ enrichment opportunities for our young people, all of which are free, which range from baking to games development, to football and many more.
