

## Working Lunch

Friday 20<sup>th</sup> January saw the launch of the Sixth Form's 'Working Lunch' programme of sessions, designed to deepen our students' knowledge of different career options as well as developing their broader skillset. A wide range of opportunities is planned, with a 'menu' that includes careers talks, debate club, mental health sessions and bespoke meetings to help students access preferred destinations and onward careers.

The inaugural session saw our aspiring teachers meet to evaluate their progress on the Bishop Grosseteste University Pre-teaching Award, and plan their forthcoming peer teaching. Our newly appointed Year 12 Sixth Form Ambassadors also gathered to plan their calendar of activities for the forthcoming term. On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January we were joined by colleagues from Humberside Police to discuss career options within this sector, and a further session with Forrester Boyd will enable students to explore careers in accountancy.

Leader of the programme, Katie Clorley said "This is an exciting development in our enrichment offer. We have consulted with the students to create a diverse range of sessions and invited guests, and students have found them really useful so far".
